Do you want to safely dispose of sensitive papers such as bank statements; credit cards and application forms; pay stubs; old bills; tax documents; medical records; floppy disks; CDs; DVDs or other documents that might make you a victim of identity fraud?

Shred-it, the world's leading on site document destruction company and the Greene County Solid Waste Management

District are sponsoring a free community shred it day on April 21, 2007, 9 a.m.-1 p.m. to safely dispose of these sensitive materials.

The event will be held at the Greene County Environmental Services office, 2145 Greene Way Blvd, Xenia, in conjunction with the District's monthly Household Hazardous Waste, Appliance, Scrap Metal and Electronic collection day. The event is free to Greene County

residents and up to 5 boxes of paper will be accepted.

Certificates of Destruction will be issued to those who request them. Binders, staples and paper clips do not have to be removed.

When papers are dropped off at site, you do not have to leave your car, Shred-it staff will remove the papers and shred them while you watch. The paper is then recycled.

Project updates

Work is on track to complete two major projects for the Greene County Sanitary Engineering Department on time.

Work has begun at the Beavercreek Water Resource Reclamation Facility to change the

method of removing phosphorus from the treated wastewater as well as to change the method of handling biosolids.

The County is currently meeting its EPA permit by removing phosphorus with

chemicals. The improvements at the plant will allow biological removal, which is less expensive. Sludge at the plant is currently being hauled to the Sugarcreek Water Resource Reclamation

Facility, dried, treated with lime, and a company is paid to remove it. Landfills can use the material as a cover, so the County will be taking its leftover sludge to a landfill.

At Sugarcreek, a multi-million dollar pro-

ject is underway to upgrade the plant to meet new standards. Improvements will include expanding the plant itself, moving the current pretreatment facility in Bellbrook to the expanded plant on 725; installing larger pipes to the plant, and installing a flow

equalization basin to prevent water from flowing through the plant untreated.

The Beavercreek improvements should be completed this year; the Sugarcreek improvements could take up to 30 months.
